19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was, he became frightened." How can we describe Peter? At once faithful and fearful, his jumbled responses remind us that he was no spiritual superman, well intentioned

though he may have been. Peter wanted to believe, and in fact showed a great deal of confidence in Christ, but the temptation to doubt was strong enough to knock him off his feet, literally. "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Jesus reprimanded Peter. The words seem harsh. After all, Peter was the only one who had enough faith to even try something as ludicrous as stepping out of the boat onto the water in the first place. But perhaps Jesus wanted to emphasize that our faith needs to be strong enough to weather the storm, so to speak. If we only believe in Jesus when the wind is calm and the waves are gone, is that truly having faith in him? Is that actually trusting in his supreme power over the forces of the universe? Peter began to sink as soon as a challenge appeared. Jesus called him, and he calls us, to stay on our feet even when the winds begin to blow. So, what are the winds that threaten our faith? What kinds of gusts are blowing today? Whatever it might be--health problems, financial concerns, relational struggles--none of it is too much for Jesus to handle. But we must step out in faith and trust him! And we need to keep our eyes on him as we do so, instead of getting distracted by the force of the challenges we face. Jesus is bigger than any problem. We have nothing to fear as long as we are walking towards him.

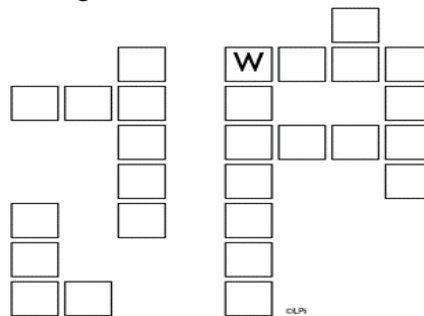
Sharing the Gospel:

Let Your Voice

Be Heard! Pope Francis has called a world meeting of Bishops (a Synod) in Fall of 2018. The topic to be addressed at the meeting is “Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment”. In preparation for that meeting the Pope is asking to hear from youth ages 16-29 about their experience of faith. Bishop Deeley is facilitating the input of youth by hosting three state-wide Listening Sessions and creating an online survey. I was happy to bring three representatives of All Saints Parish’s youth to one of these meetings. We met in Scarborough with more than 100 people to pray and to provide an opportunity for the youth to share their responses to these four questions: 1. What do you need from the Church today? 2. What would help you feel valued and like you truly belong to your parish community? What keeps you or your peers from participating in the life of your parish (Mass, programs, committees, gatherings, etc.)? 4. What can the Church do to better accompany you in your life’s journey as a young disciple of Jesus? The conversation was structured in such a way as to let every person answer each question and to have their answer recorded. In small groups the youth had to choose two answers for each question to share with the whole group. The next step is to combine these collected answers with the answers to the online survey and for Bishop Deeley to send these to Washington DC where they will be combined with all other input from across the United States. The United States Council of Catholic Bishops will then send the collected input to Rome where it will be put together with survey results from around the world. This will provide background information to help the Pope prepare for the Synod. – Sheila Murphy

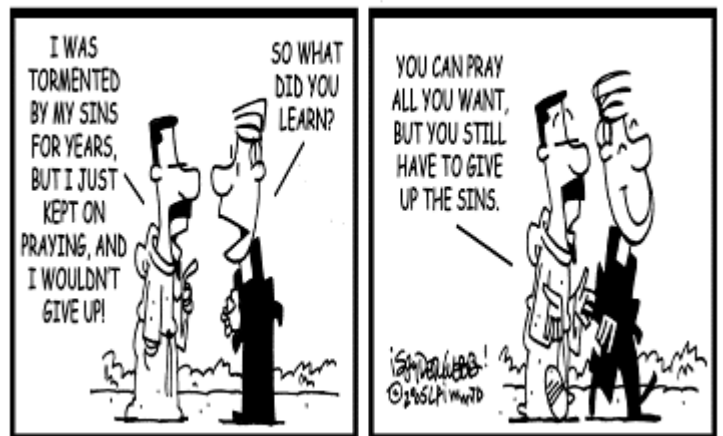
