20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." This woman was an outsider. She was a Canaanite, not an Israelite, and as such she would have been considered ritually unclean. But she approached Jesus nonetheless and asked for his help. And Jesus used this opportunity to

teach his disciples an important lesson. In the verses directly before today's passage, Jesus had told Peter that what defiles a person comes from the heart, not from ignoring external purity practices. Then, Jesus traveled with his disciples from Galilee to the region of Tyre and Sidon where they were much more likely to encounter someone considered to be unclean. At first it appeared that Jesus wasn't going to acknowledge the woman who begged for help. His comment, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs," was a common comparison between Jews (the children) and Canaanites (the dogs). But, in fact, Jesus said this only to go right ahead and break this social code! He showed by his actions that it did not matter whether someone was Jewish or not, what mattered was the faith in a person's heart. And this woman proved to Jesus and the doubting disciples that she had great faith. How many others would have even approached Jesus to ask for his help? How many others would have persevered when he appeared unresponsive? By pausing in his response, and first mentioning the standard reply, Jesus gave this woman the opportunity to demonstrate her great faith. And then, he answered her request and praised her extraordinary faith. What a lesson for his prejudiced disciples! And what a lesson for us, both to persevere in faith, and never to judge others on mere appearances.

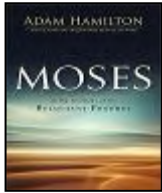

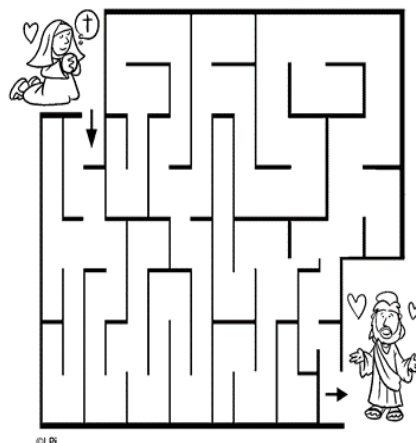

Searching for a New Coordinator of Youth Ministry for All Saints Parish.

Yes, we are in the midst of looking for the right person for this role. What does the Coordinator need to have beyond what's listed in the job description on the parish website? Love! Three loves in particular: Love of God, love of teenagers and love of our Tradition. First: Love of God. In order for one to lead well in ministry, he must have an active relationship with God. He must be in daily communication with God. This is the source of his wisdom. This is her authority to lead others to their own connection with God.

Second, the Coordinator of Youth Ministry must have a real love of teenagers! Teenagers live in an state of enormous change and the Coordinator and all volunteer youth ministers too need to see deeply into the teenager to see the part that doesn't change, the part that is very good. This is the core, the heart of the teenager who is the beloved son or daughter of God. A youth minister can see beyond bold mistakes or timid reluctance to the strong, gifted child of God who desires to emerge. Along with parents and the whole parish, youth ministers encourage this heart of the teenager to emerge and to begin to trust God.

Finally the Coordinator must love our Tradition. *How can I base my life on God if I can't see God?* Read the gospels and get to know Jesus, the visible face of the invisible God. *How can I find belonging in a culture so committed to individualism?* Come to mass, receive the Eucharist and become part of the awesome Body of Christ. *How can I make a difference in the world?* Learn to pray, really communicate with God from great teachers in our Tradition.

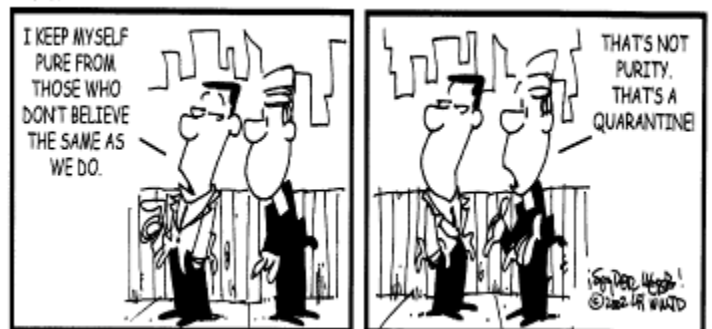
