21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church." Simon got a new name after his profession of faith. As soon as he declared to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God," Jesus renamed him with a title that means "rock."

And with that name he gave Peter the mission to be a solid foundation upon which he would build his church. Not Peter's church. Not James or Paul's church. Not Martin Luther's or John Calvin's or anybody else's. This is Jesus' church, the church of Christ himself, that we call the Catholic Church. So it was Christ himself who desired to give authority in the church--"the keys to the kingdom of heaven"--to a human leader. Peter was thus established as the first pope. He exercised a special kind of headship, within the community of the apostles and the church at large, because Jesus gave him the power to do so, not because Peter claimed it for himself. And so too every pope since, right down to our Holy Father today, exercises this unique leadership within the Church. What a gift this is to us! Jesus knew well the human tendency to squabble and disagree, to argue and compete. He knew that the church would be prone to all of this because of her members, and that providing a final voice of authority, saying in effect that "the buck stops here" would be helpful for maintaining unity. As Catholics, even in spite of the differing opinions and perspectives that are manifest in the Church, we nonetheless maintain a strong sense of identity and belief thanks in large part to the papacy. Today, may we give thanks for the pope and pray for him as he strives to lead all of us closer and closer to Christ.

It's More than a Building

The campaign for the new multipurpose building began just over a year ago and we're making great progress towards the goal of \$4.7 million. We have a lot to celebrate:

Our design was completed by Scott Simons and Sitelines. We received final approval from the Town Planning Board.

The diocese has approved our finances and will back any construction loan required.

The competitive selection process for a general contractor has begun.

The ceremonial groundbreaking will take place this fall! While we've reached over 70% of our financial goal, we need your help to secure the final 30% so that we can minimize the need for a construction loan. If you've already pledged, THANK YOU – you should have received a notice regarding your payments (please contact the bookkeeping office at 207-443-3423 if you have questions). You're among the 21% of the parish families who have made a pledge.

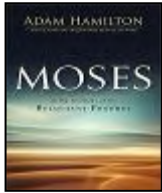

Teenagers Like to Experiment. Does that make you nervous? What if there's a way to connect experimentation and faith? Let's give it a try. Yes, it's safe to try these experiments at home. Or at school. Or at work.

1. Maybe there's someone I don't like, because they're mean to me or my friends. I can pray for them. What can I pray about my enemy? I know it can't be considered prayer to "pray against" someone, but I also have to pray honestly. Try this experiment for one minute each day. I can pray something like this. *God, please help this person to get a better connection with You, because it seems if they know You better, they'll be kinder. Send them Your healing to soften their heart. Help me not to be so annoyed with them.* At the end of one week here's what to evaluate: How has my attitude toward this person changed? If my attitude has improved, the prayer has had results.

2. Ask God to show up! At the beginning of each day, ask God to somehow make an appearance in your day. Say, *Lord, help me believe more strongly in you by showing up in my day in a way that I can recognize Your presence. I will do my part by looking for your presence as often as I can remember throughout the day.* At the end of the day write down whatever you believe was God's way of communicating with you. This is a classic experiment because we're writing down results! At the end of one week, look over your notes and see if you have a sense of how present God has been in your week.

Ask for a nudge. If we could actually see all the opportunities to do good in one day we'd realize we don't have time in the day to respond to them all. (Did you ever see the movie *Groundhog Day*?) Here's the experiment. Pray this in the morning: *Holy Spirit, there are too many moments in my day that clamor for my attention. Please nudge me when there's something I need to do for someone else, something that helps me do my part in creating the Reign of God.* What might this nudge inspire? It might be sitting with someone different at lunch. It might be making a phone call. It might be saying yes to an awkward person who asks you to be their partner on some project. Pray this prayer in the morning for a week. At the end of the week ask if your life has become a bit more adventurous.
