29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Jesus had a brilliant way of navigating tricky situations. In today's Gospel, the Pharisees "plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech." But he outwitted them, as usual. They wanted to catch him being a political rebel; they expected him to suggest that paying taxes to Caesar was unnecessary or even unjust. But instead, he shifted the focus. He emphasized the importance of fulfilling our civic responsibilities but also the necessity of giving to God what we owe him.

So, how do we know what we should "repay" to God? Well, Jesus' response to the Pharisees gives us our answer. He looked at the Roman coin that bore the image of Caesar on it. Then he concluded that the coin belonged to Caesar because it was made in his likeness. Now, what bears the image of God? What is made in his likeness? We are! "God created man in his image; in the divine image he created him; male and female he created them" (Gn 1:27). If the coin belonged to Caesar, we belong to God. We repay God by giving him ourselves!

This self-giving is what the Second Vatican Council called "the obedience of faith." Through this spiritual obedience, we freely commit ourselves to God, "offering the full submission of intellect and will to God" (Dei Verbum #5). Jesus is calling us today to use our will to choose to follow God. Indeed, the one thing we can give God in return for the gift of life is our will. He gave us the freedom to love him or not. And while the choice is always ours, today Jesus encourages us to make the right decision by giving God what is really his: ourselves!

CONGRATULATIONS DEACON PATRICK!

On Sunday October 8th at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Bishop Robert Deeley ordained Patrick Finn, a native son of St. Mary Church in Bath, here in All Saints Parish, to the Transitional Diaconate. ““We are grateful for the growing vocation in Patrick. In this new ministry in his life, we join

with Patrick in another step in his journey to the priesthood,” the Bishop stated in his homily.

There were many folks there from All Saints Parish, as well as Prince of Peace parish in Lewiston where Deacon Patrick ministered. Indeed, though it was a regular parish Mass for the people of the Cathedral there were parishioners from parishes spanning the diocese on hand to celebrate with Deacon Patrick and his family.

“It’s just amazing,” Deacon Finn said. “It’s been a long time in preparation, and just to see the whole people from all around the diocese, and from beyond also, it was just amazing.”

Patrick had spent time in formation with the Franciscan Friars of the Third Order Regular, before leaving them to work at the Black and Indian Missions office in Washington DC. He then had the opportunity to return home to work at Prince of Peace parish in Lewiston as director of Faith Formation. Being back home and reconnecting with some long-time priest friends led him to reflect again on his call to the priesthood and to apply to the Diocese of Portland.

We here in All Saints parish offer our prayers of thanksgiving for Patrick’s ordination and his continued formation leading up to ordination to the priesthood. To Jim & Joanne Finn, Patrick’s parents we offer congratulations – the wonderful foundation that Patrick received at St. Mary and at home opened his heart to hear God’s call and we are all grateful.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

How does Christ's love get planted in us and grow into faith? At the end of

Matthew's Gospel, Christ gives the disciples a mission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

This command is for all of us. We Christians have a mission to preach the Gospel, with words and actions, to all in our daily path. When, through our efforts, the Good News has reached the ears and hearts of those who have never been baptized, the grace of the Holy Spirit calls them to new life through the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. To welcome them, form them in the faith, and initiate them into the Catholic Church, we who are already baptized walk with them on their journey. Their apprenticeship includes prayer, catechesis (education), involvement in the community, participation in worship, and joining in the service and mission of Christ.

Mrs. Walsh with Fourth Grade News

We've just begun a unit on the Human Body and its six major systems. Besides classroom activities, we will be working in the computer lab on a Human Body Webquest. This project will engage all students by providing different modes of learning. When the students finish, we will have a Parent Night to view all projects.



This month's book project is a Cereal Box Historical Fiction project. Students are learning about historical fiction. I have read a novel to them that was set in medieval times. 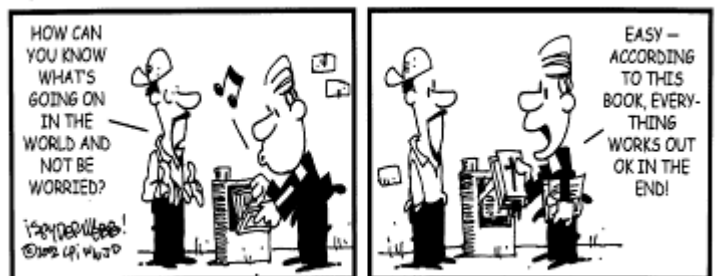
